These next weeks will be full of blessings. We bless the graduates, the 8th graders, and then we will bless the garden, the columbarium and the bikes.

Jan Richardson, a Methodist pastor who wrote a beautiful book of blessings after her husband died unexpectedly, writes, "Within the struggle, joy, pain, and delight that attend our life, there is an invisible circle of grace that enfolds and encompasses us in every moment. Blessings help us to perceive this circle of grace, to find our place of belonging within it, and to receive the strength the circle holds for us."

Blessings help us to perceive the circle of grace. It's not magic, but it gives us a bigger picture and lets us release our children and our resources into the wider world where we have so little control.

Impermanence. It all changes and holding on or hiding doesn't make things stay the same, it kills the spirit and joy of life. We get to have a relationship with Jesus who reveals love that never changes, a love that holds us and blesses us so we can have the courage to let go.

We are getting ready for another fabulous summer! The program begins on Monday, June 6.

There are some changes to summer lunch this year. We no longer qualify for USDA lunch reimbursement, but we are able to have a "normal" summer lunch with the generosity of Benito and Frances C. Gaguine Foundation and the Alaska Community Foundation.

There will be some new things. We no longer need to count meals and adhere to a strict meal plan. Our menu will stay basically the same, but we won't need quite the amount of administrators. The grant provides for one full-time person who will oversee summer lunch, shopping, day camp, food pantry, and residential camp. Council has discussed with Hannah Harvey about serving in this position.

There is also funding for a volunteer recruiter and coordinator (20 hours at \$18) and an activities director (20 hours at \$18).

Online registration for youth, day campers, volunteers, and staff will soon be available. Corbin Corson, Camdyn Landvik, Elijah Harvey, Lauren Stichert, Sven Rasmussen, and Adella Dihle are returning as guides this year.

Staff is expected to have a food handlers' card and do training in sexual abuse prevention and conflict management.

Training for volunteers and staff will be inperson at 11 a.m., Sunday, May 22 at SOV.



Congregational News

Land Swap and Driveway Move

The land swap, drainage, and moving the driveway are all connected. The survey and plans for the project are available in the annual report. There will be a congregational meeting on Sunday, May 15 following worship to discuss the driveway move with an estimated project completion date of October 2023. A budget will be presented.

Council is recommending the driveway move for the following reasons:

- * Safety.
- * Original plan when church was built.
- * Cost effective.
- * Allow better use of land where existing driveway is located.
- * Drainage.

Church Budget

The winter took a huge toll on personal budgets and the church budget. We had to do \$29,565 in building maintenance in 2021 plus:

- * Plowing the driveway for all of 2021 was \$4625; for three months in 2022 it's \$4225.
- * Shoveling the roof was \$2500.
- * Drainage pipe was \$3500.
- * Oil for 2021 was \$4766; for three months in 2022 it's \$4865.

Part of the budget for 2022 was an attempt to move the pastor's salary closer to synod guidelines. This has placed a strain on finances.

We are still doing okay, but we are no longer operating with much of a buffer. The mortgage will be paid off in August so that will help us save for building repair!

If you are able to pledge or give consistently that helps us live within our means. If you are able to give a little extra this spring to help recover from winter that would also be incredibly helpful. Church Clean-up Saturday

The Property Management Committee encourages us to participate in spring cleaning from 8 a.m. to Noon, Saturday, May 7. Join us to get the yard and building ready for summer. We need at least a dozen people so the work it isn't overwhelming.

Scholarship for Christian Service and Education

Applications are available at church and on the website under ministries. They are due July 6. These are open to any who are in higher education and seek to live out their faith in their vocation. Thank you to Joy Will, Dean Rasmussen and Michelle Weaver for serving on the committee. Please consider giving to the scholarship fund to boost our account back up closer to \$5000. We are currently around \$2500.

Columbarium Update

The columbarium will ship on May 9 and arrive sometime late May. Our goal is to have it installed by Pentecost (June 5). We can start having services to intern ashes after Sunday, June 26. Please talk to Pastor Tari to arrange a date. We still need around \$2000 to do all the site work for its installation. If you have considered purchasing a niche, now is the time.
